Abu Ja'far Muhammad ibn Musa al-Khwarizmi lived in Baghdad, around 780 to 850 CE (or AD). He was one of the first to write about algebra (using words, not letters). Around 825 he wrote the book "Hisab Al-jabr w'al-muqabala", from which we get the word algebra (meaning 'restoration of broken parts').

# al-Khwarizmi, the Father of Algebra

One of the most prominent contributors to scientific progression, Muḥammad ibn Mūsā al-Khwārizmī, is otherwise known as the father of algebra. Born in modern-day Uzbekistan, al-Khwārizmī first appeared in historical records as an instructor in the House of Wisdom in the Abbasid capital of Baghdad. He was the first to discover problem-solving formally referred to as al-Jabr.

The book provides a systematic solution for linear and quadratic equations.

# The History of Algebra | al-Khwarizmi

One of the first Directors of the House of Wisdom in Bagdad in the early 9th Century was an outstanding Persian mathematician called Muhammad Al-Khwarizmi. He oversaw the translation of the major Greek and Indian mathematical and astronomy works (including those of Brahmagupta) into Arabic, and produced original work which had a lasting influence on the advance of Muslim and (after his works spread to Europe through Latin translations in the 12th Century) later European mathematics.

# Al-Khwarizmi - The Father of Algebra

Al-Khwarizmi: The Father of Algebra Historical Background Abu Ja'far Muhammad ibn Musa al-Khwarizmi was born circa 780 CE. Although his name indicates that his family was originally from the region Khwarizm near the Aral Sea, historians believe that al-Khwarizmi was born in the city of Baghdad in present day Iraq (Calinger, 199).

Abu Ja'far Muhammad ibn Musa al-Khwarizmi was a mathematician, astronomer, astrologer, geographer and scholar in the House of Wisdom (otherwise known as Baitul Hikmah in Arabic) in the city of Baghdad during the reign of Caliph al Ma'mun of the Abbasid Caliphate, in an era commonly referred to as (part of) the Islamic Golden Age.

In time, al-Khwarizmi's works were translated into Latin. The Italian mathematician Fibonacci (c. 1170-1250), also known as Leonardo of Pisa, is generally credited with popularizing Hindu-Arabic numerals in the West. He learned about them during his travels in the Mediterranean world and thereafter wrote his Book of Calculation.
