The M ê n-an-Tol (or 'Men an Toll') is a small formation of standing stones on the Penwith moorland in Cornwall. It is also known locally as the "Crick Stone". The name 'M ê n-an-Tol' in the Cornish Language literally means "the hole stone", which is a description of the main stone.

Men-An-Tol - Cornish for "stone of the hole" - is a unique monument. It consists of a circular central stone (approximately 3.5ft tall and 4.5ft wide), two flanking stones and a fallen outlier. The central stone is the aforementioned "stone of the hole", the perforation being about 18 inches wide and aligned with the two flanking stones.
