Unlike architecture and construction, educational design is rarely constructed on a " green-field " (piece of land that has not previously been built on) site. Instead, educational courses, materials, resources, assessment, and curriculum are often in place and design work is therefore more often, and more accurately referred to as re-design work (Goodyear & Dimitriadis, 2013).
