To Most and others within the anarchist movement, by contrast, the idea of propaganda by deed, or the attentat (attack), had a very specific logic. Among anarchism's founding premises was the idea that capitalist society was a place of constant violence: every law, every church, every paycheck was based on force.

Propaganda must affect the enemy's policy and actions. By suppressing propagandistically desirable material which can provide the enemy with useful intelligence. By openly disseminating propaganda whose contents or tone causes the enemy to draw the desired conclusions.

<u>Propaganda - Goebbels' Principles</u>

During the time of the Harlem Riot of 1935, the idea of propaganda was relatively new, and people didn't realize how much influence the journalists had over their behavior. By writing phrases like "negro boy brutally beaten." The journalists stirred up the spectators' emotions and ultimately caused them to riot.
