Architects of the Dutch Colonial State in Indonesia. Two names stand out as being architects of the new Dutch colonial state in Indonesia. Indonesia has a population of approximately 250 million people, and the government recognizes 1,128 ethnic groups. Recent laws and government decrees use the term Masyarakat adat to refer to indigenous peoples. The national organization of indigenous peoples, Aliansi Masyarakat Adat Nusantara (AMAN), estimates that the number of indigenous peoples in Indonesia is between 50 and 70 million people.
