Infancy corresponds to Piaget's
"Sensorimotor" stage of cognitive

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development, and to two of Erikson's stages; the "trust vs. mistrust" stage during the first year of life, and the "autonomy vs. shame and doubt" stage that follows closely after. Piaget's work describes how infants come to understand their world through their bodies and senses.

Neurological research shows that the early years play a key role in children ' s brain development. Babies begin to learn about the world around them from a very early age –

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including during the prenatal, perinatal (immediately before and after birth) and postnatal period. Children ' s early experiences – the bonds they form with their parents and their first learning experiences – deeply affect their future physical, cognitive, emotional and social

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development.

The infant development process
integrates front-back, left-right and
top-bottom so the body can move as
