Infant development is characterised by the emergence of many skills and behaviour patterns which indicate that infants may have notions, regarded by adults to be mathematical in nature.

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Infancy corresponds to Piaget's "Sensorimotor" stage of cognitive development, and to two of Erikson's stages; the "trust vs. mistrust" stage during the first year of life, and the "autonomy vs. shame and doubt" stage that follows closely after. Piaget's work describes how infants come to understand their world through their bodies and senses.

Neurological research shows that the early years play a key role in children's brain development. Babies begin to learn about the world around them from a very early age - including during the prenatal, perinatal (immediately before and after birth) and postnatal period. The infant development process integrates front-back, left-right and top-bottom so the body can move as an integrated system. Infants don't get up out of bed and start crawling around. They use what's called serpentine movements to move around, not unlike sperm, tadpoles, inchworms or snakes. These serpentine movements are woven into us.
