The Children and Families Act 2014 states that Schools have a duty to ensure that there are specific arrangements to cater for any pupils with medical needs such as asthma, diabetes, epilepsy.... The Department for Education ' s revised guidance stipulates that: a medical conditions policy must be in place, so that pupils with medical conditions have full access to education, including school trips and physical education.

Children and Families Act 2014 - implications for schools

The Children and Families Act 2014 obtained royal assent and became law on 13 March 2014. This is a landmark and wide-ranging act designed to fully reform services for vulnerable children, by giving them greater protection, paying special attention to those with additional needs, and also helping parents and the family as a whole. This summary outlines the key changes the Act made to the safeguarding and child protection system and services for children and families.

If your child got support before September 2014 Your child will move to an education, health and care ( EHC ) plan. This will normally happen at a planned review, or when your child moves school.

Children with special educational needs and disabilities ...

Section 100 Children and Families Act 2014 places a statutory duty on governing bodies of maintained schools, academies and pupil referral units to make arrangements at school to support pupils with medical conditions. A child ' s mental and physical health should be properly supported in school, so that the pupil can play a full and active role in school life, remain healthy and achieve their academic potential.

These Regulations supplement the procedural framework assessing a child or young person with special educational needs, and the procedure for making, reviewing, amending and ceasing to maintain an EHC plan, set out in Part 3 of the Children and Families Act 2014 ( ' the Act ' ). They require local authorities to notify the child ' s parent or the young person of decisions within certain ...
