The Red Rose of Lancaster was the heraldic badge adopted by the royal House of Lancaster in the 14th century. In modern times it symbolises the county of Lancashire. The exact species or cultivar which it represents is thought to be *Rosa gallica officinalis*. The red rose was first adopted as a heraldic badge by John of Gaunt, 1st Duke of Lancaster third surviving son of King Edward III of England and father of King Henry IV, the first Lancastrian king, who seized the throne from his first cousin
