The syndrome view of terrorism also suggests that there could exist external root causes of terrorism, such as poverty or political oppression, which inevitably breed terrorism. In contrast, the tool view of terrorism does not assume anything psychologically abnormal or unique about terrorists.

We can at least say that terrorism is a special kind of strategy that uses public violence intended to effect social or political change, but for an act to be reliably categorized as terrorism or terroristic in nature, it must feature the proximate victimization of noncombatants (e.g., civilians) to influence far-more-distant actors (e.g., governments) and agendas (Taylor, 1988).
